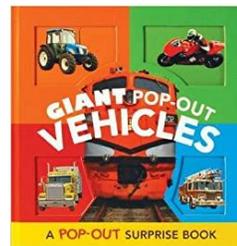
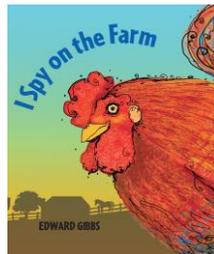
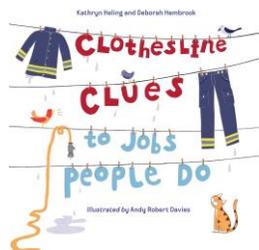


Do It Yourself Storytime

Other Related Activities

Infant

Playing with objects with different textures will help your baby develop their sense of touch as well as help with fine motor skills. Put some crushed ice, water with soap suds, tree bark, sponges, and/or other things that have a variety of textures and are safe to play with, in a baking pan and let your baby play and explore.

Toddler and Preschool

Before going out to the backyard, front yard or park, make a list with your child of some things you might see. List things by their qualities, like texture, color, sound, etc. For example, you can write “5 things that are green”, or “two rough or soft things”. Then, use your list to do a scavenger hunt. This activity promotes shape recognition (by hunting for shapes), as well as mindfulness (by hunting for things by their smell, texture, sound, etc.).
